THE REALITY OF INDUSTRIAL ANIMAL AGRICULTURE

Animal Outlook is dedicated to going undercover at industrial animal agriculture facilities to expose the truth about what happens to animals in the food system. In 2024, our investigations took us to over a dozen Foster Farms facilities in California, where we uncovered shocking cruelty.

Sadly, the abuses we discovered are common to the chicken industry. AO continues to call for greater accountability for corporations who allow these practices to continue in their supply chains.




ANIMAL OUTLOOK GOES INTERNATIONAL

While the core of our work will always remain focused on ending the use of animals in agriculture in the United States, AO expanded its impact in 2024 through two new additions to our programs: International Investigation Trainings, and the Farm Transitions Broadcast Program.

AO has been performing undercover investigations into industrial animal agriculture for over two decades. In that time, we've become experts in identifying facilities for investigation, placing investigators in the field while minimizing risk, working with law enforcement to hold companies accountable, and releasing our findings to the public. This wealth of expertise is now available to animal protection organizations outside the United States who want to learn how to perform high level investigations in their own countries. AO's training program spans the entire investigation process, from hiring the investigator to working with the media once the investigation is complete.

Several organizations based in South America and Africa have already participated in the training with one organization, *Asociación para el Rescate y Bienestar de los Animales*, releasing their own investigation in the summer of 2024.

In a similar vein, our learnings from our Farm Transition program are available to similar organizations through our Farm Transitions Broadcast program. The Broadcast program synthesizes the lessons gained from years of research into the economics and agricultural details of transitioning farms and offers them to organizations who would like to help farmers achieve similar results in their own countries.



A COMMUNITY APPROACH TO A GLOBAL PROBLEM

Quick Facts

- Each transition can remove hundreds of thousands of animals from the industrial agriculture system
- Farmers can often use existing infrastructure in their transition, such as converting a chicken shed to a greenhouse
- AO connects farmers with purchasers for their new crops
- Each transition is completely self-funded by the farmer

AO's Farm Transitions program took a huge step forward in 2024 with the groundbreaking for our pilot transition. Our partner farm, located in southern Alabama, is being converted to grow lettuce in transformed chicken sheds, supplying the Dothan school district with fresh produce. This initiative not only eliminates approximately 500,000 chickens annually from the food system but also creates a sustainable business model for farmers seeking alternatives to industrial animal agriculture. The project has already attracted interest from 12 additional school districts and Alabama's Department of Agriculture, demonstrating its potential for broader impact. As a proof-ofconcept, this transition is sure to inspire other farmers to follow suit, creating a ripple effect that benefits animals, farmers, and local communities while building momentum for similar transitions nationwide.

Chicken sheds often house tens of thousands of birds. These structures get so crowded, it becomes difficult to see the ground. Through AO's Farm Transitions program, these sheds are being reimagined to grow produce for local communities.

GIVING TOMORROW'S ADVOCATES A VOICE



In 2024, Animal Outlook's vegan advocacy program achieved significant milestones in making plant-based living more accessible. TryVeg.com experienced record engagement, where nearly 4,000 individuals signed the VegPledge, a promise to take the first step in their vegan journey.

In the world of corporate engagement, The Fight For Our Future (FFF) campaign outreached to over a dozen organizations and institutions to secure promises that no organizational funds would be used to buy nonvegan products for things like team luncheons and breakroom supplies.

A highlight of the year was our community-building initiative through the expansion of our volunteer network. Centered around the Animal Outlook Network, a brand new social-science backed training website, our team of nearly 2,000 volunteers has a suite of new resources to help them become better vegan advocates in their community.

Through strategic collaborations with influencers, health professionals, and community leaders, we've expanded our reach and credibility, making veganism more mainstream and achievable for people from all walks of life. These efforts have contributed to a measurable increase in people committing to and maintaining a vegan lifestyle.



FROM CAGE TO COURTROOM; LEGAL PROGRESS IN 2024

AO's legal advocacy team continued the organization's reputation of being leaders in the legal animal protection field in 2024.

In November, we received word that the owner and manager of Jannat Farm, the subject of a 2022 AO investigation, would plead guilty to animal cruelty charges as a result of the evidence we provided.


In collaboration with Legal Impact for Chickens, we took action against Harvey's Market, a DC-based meat retailer, which was making false claims about the humane treatment of ducks and geese in connection with their foie gras sales. Due to our legal action, Harvey's Market announced in December that they would cease selling foie gras.

Through all of our legal work, Animal Outlook looks to hold those in positions of power accountable and provide the public with the information to make informed choices about the purchases they make. That's why we, in collaboration with Richman Law & Policy, sued Alderfer Family Farm based on misleading and deceptive marketing claims it makes about its egg products. Alderfer, the complaint alleges, misleads consumers by marketing its eggs as laid by "Free Roaming" hens when many hens have no outdoor access at all. This is not only cruel to the animals in their supply chain, it misleads the public and creates confusion about how animals are actually treated in industrial animal agriculture.

When not in the courtroom, our legal team was active in sharing their expertise with the greater legal community as guest lecturers and professors at law schools and conferences throughout the country, as well as in publications such as NYC Law Review and USC Law Journal.
